4. Demonstrated high quality leadership and people management skills.
5. Excellent communication skills, including experience in providing regular honest, performance feedback to playing group and individuals.
6. Great relationship-building skills with players, support staff and club volunteers.
7. Ability to 'manage up' to the Board.
8. Ability to represent the club as an ambassador of the club.
